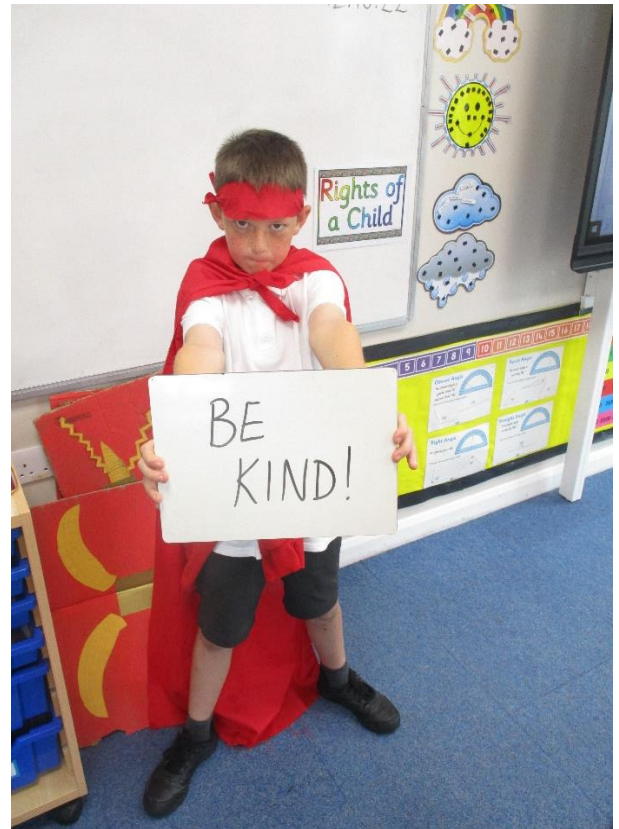
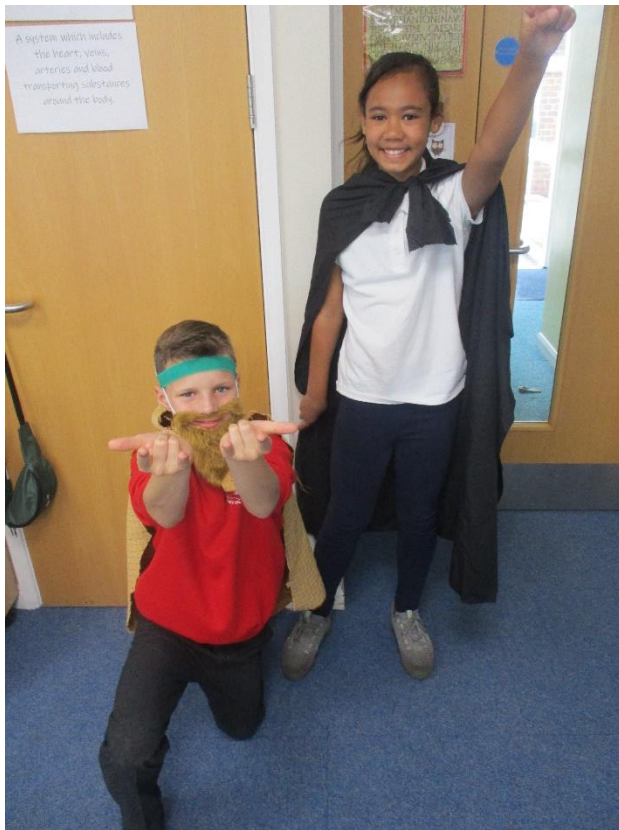
As a whole school treat, we enjoyed the giant inflatable day and had a great time bouncing around in our teams.



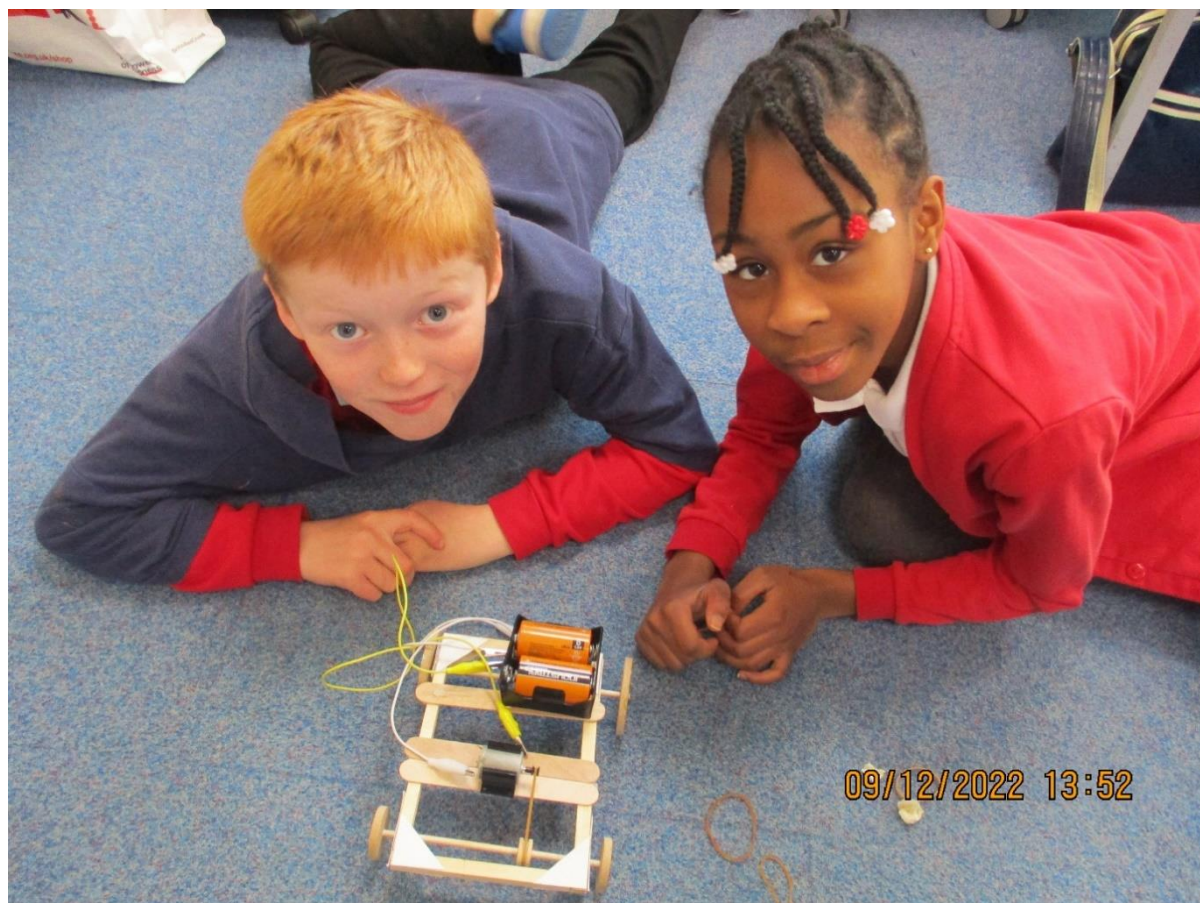
As part of 'international week', we studied Japan - learning about national wildlife, food and traditions.

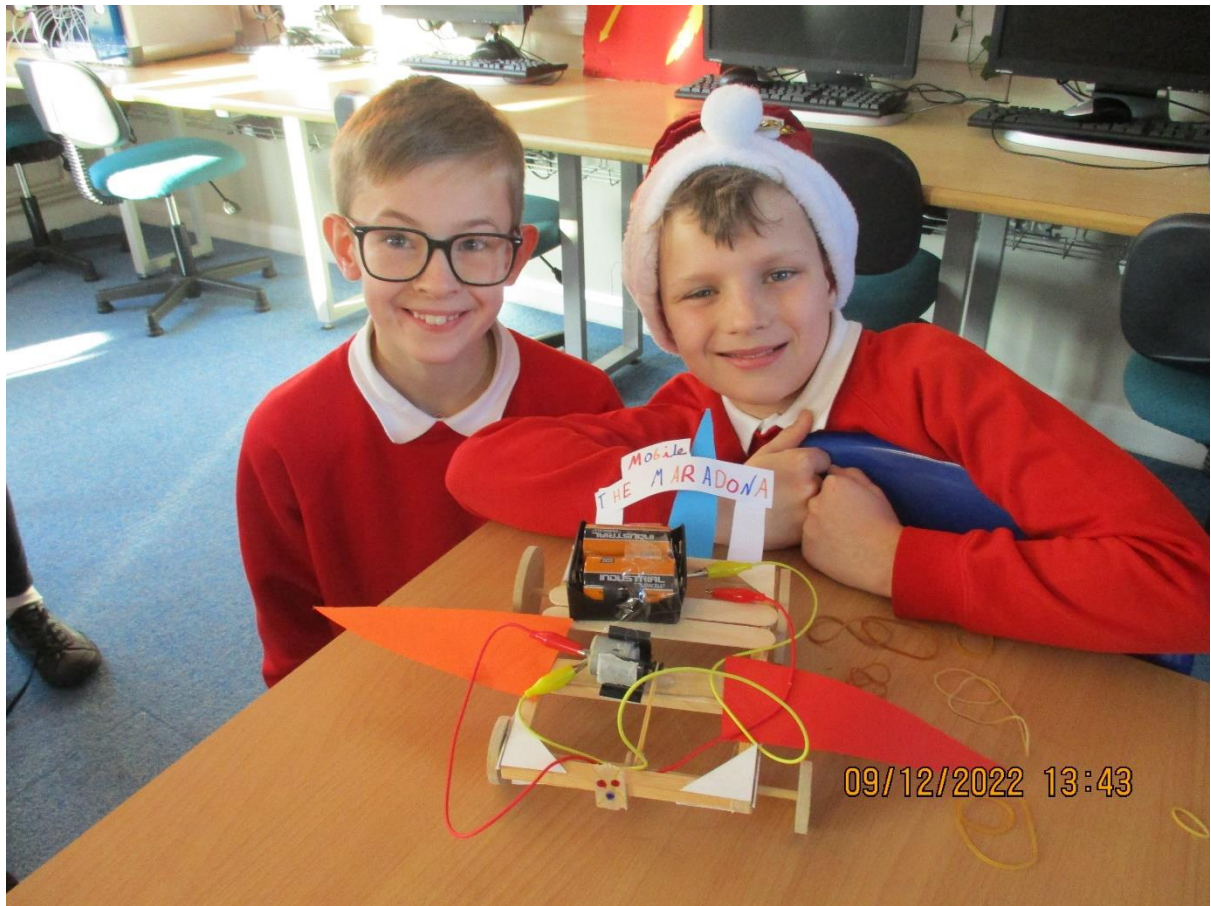


To celebrate Harvest, we wrote our own play called 'Harvest Heroes' which we performed to parents and families.

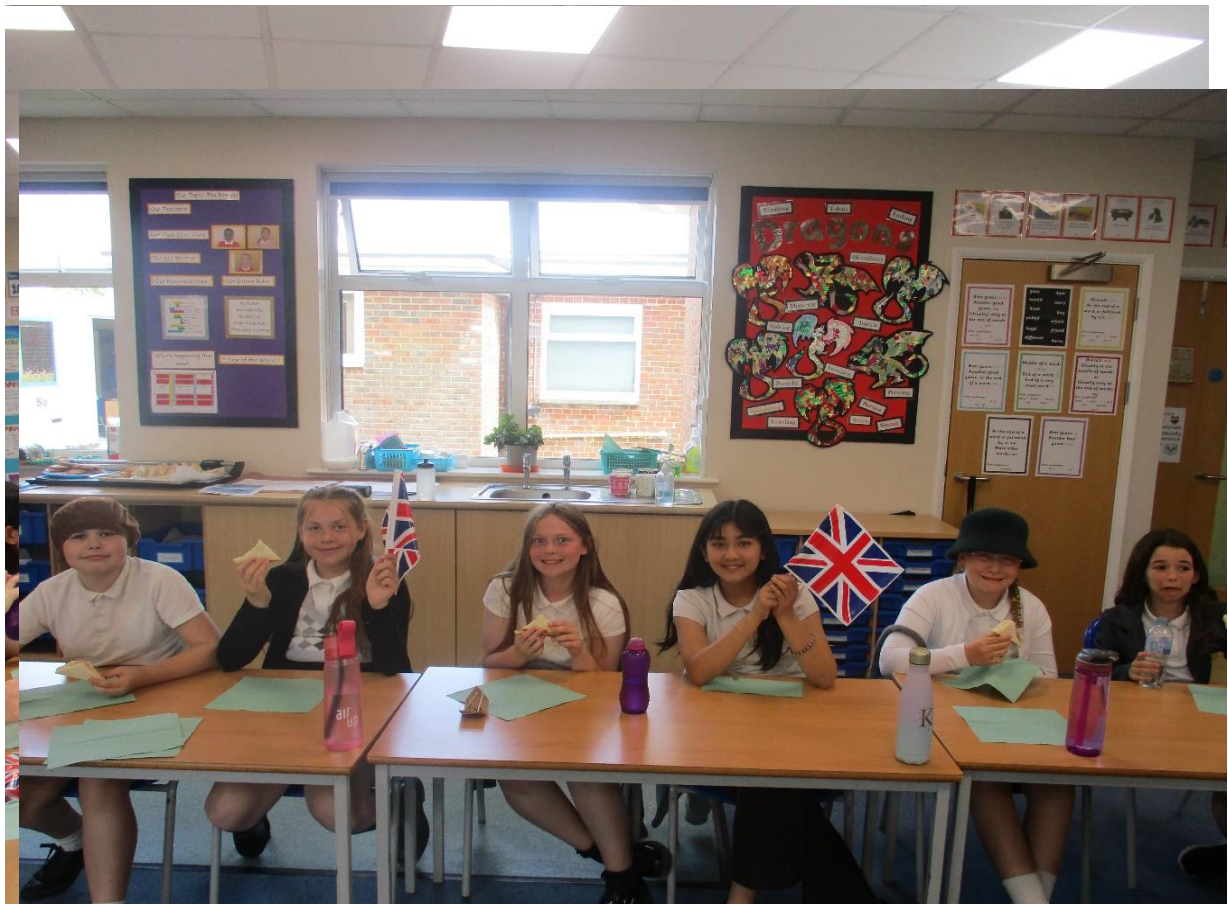


We learned about the blitz and bomb shelters. This helped us when designing and making our own Anderson shelter models.
