## A Toys Story!





This term our topic is 'A Toys Story!' We will be learning all about old and new toys and learning the story of The Gruffalo. We will be taking a trip to the play park and creating our own play park for The Gruffalo in our D.T lessons. We will also be learning a Gruffalo dance in our PE lessons and working towards a Christmas Performance for the end of term!



In our English lessons we will be looking at the story of The Gruffalo - finding suitable adjectives to describe the Gruffalo, his child and the BIG BAD mouse.

In Maths we will be continuing to look at place value to 20 and addition and subtraction within 10. In Science the children will be looking at seasonal changes. We will be finding out about the meaning of 'Advent' and learning some popular Christmas songs in our music lessons.

November where children can bring in one of their favourite toys from home to share with their friends!

We will be making lots of yummy food for the Gruffalo including crumble and biscuits!
