Maths

Some of the things we will be exploring include:

- Calculating with money
- Learning about multiplication
- Learning division

You could help your child at home by:

Practicing the 2s, 5s and 10 x table. MyMaths is good for this: https://www.mymaths.co.uk/

Giving your child experience of handling money and calculating with money when out shopping.

Dividing objects around the home e.g. sharing food items between 3 people.

Computing

We will be looking at how to search for information on the internet safely and how to present information in a PowerPoint to support our work in English. It would be useful if your child has some knowledge of how to use a search engine such as Google and how to use the features contained in the PowerPoint program.

PE

In PE the children are going to be developing their gymnastics skills. Please could they have their full PE kit in on Mondays and Wednesdays.

English

We will be learning to write exciting information texts on Arctic animals which we will then publish as an information leaflet. We will also be writing descriptive paragraphs about the amazing Northern Lights.

You could help your child at home by:

Reading an information book about The Arctic/Antarctic or animals in general and discussing the features (pictures, sub-headings, labelled pictures etc.). The DK Books are really good for this. The website below has lots of child-friendly information on the Arctic:

You could also look at pictures/videos of the northern lights (YouTube/Google images) and describe the colours and how they move.

Geography

In geography we will be looking at the climate, habitats, people, places and animals of the Arctic and Antarctic. It would be useful if your child has some information on this (use of internet/library). Point out the countries that form part of the Arctic and where Antarctica is on a globe or atlas.
