GOVERNORS' CURRICULUM COMMITTEE

MEMBERSHIP AND MEETINGS

The committee shall meet at least once a term. It shall consist of seven governors including the Headteacher. Three governors shall comprise a quorum.

TERMS OF REFERENCE

The committee has the following responsibilities:

1. To develop a general awareness of all aspects of the school's curriculum, and assessment arrangements, ensuring its implementation;
2. To ensure that each pupil receives a broad and balanced curriculum relevant to his/her particular needs including:
 - The National Curriculum
 - Religious Education
 - Special Needs provision
 - Personal, Social, Health and Citizenship Education (P.S.H.C.E.)
 - Sex Education
3. To participate in formulating and reviewing the School Improvement Plan annually and make recommendation to the Governing Body regarding resources required to implement the plan;
4. To ensure the required curriculum information is made available to parents and other interested parties;
5. To ensure that any aspects of Health and Safety legislation and/or guidelines relevant to the curriculum are observed;
6. To be aware of how teaching is organised, how the curriculum is monitored and evaluated, the procedures for assessing pupils' attainment including target setting and the standards achieved by pupils including the progress made towards achieving any targets set;
7. To provide information about curriculum based matters for the Governing Body;
8. To ensure Governors are appointed to accept responsibility for overseeing curriculum areas;
9. To advise the Governing Body on arrangements required for pupils with Special Needs and/or Disabilities;
10. To consider complaints relating to the curriculum and to advise the Governing Body;
11. To review relevant school policies and the school prospectus on a rolling programme;
12. At the start of each academic year review arrangements and policy for all off-site activities and educational visits.
