This half term, we will be learning all about the lives of people who lived in Stone Age Britain! Below is an outline of our learning in a range of key subjects. I hope you find it useful when supporting your child with their learning.



Our key text in English this half term is 'Stone Age Boy' by Satoshi Kitamura. This story will be the inspiration for writing recounts, diary entries and poetry.



Maths

This half term we will be covering:

- Time (understanding units of time & calculating duration)
- Properties of Shape. We will learn to recognise and describe angles, 2D shapes and 3D shapes.

Talking about time, providing lots hands-on opportunities for your child to name and describe shapes in their environment.

In Science, we are going to explore different types of rock, and learn how fossils are formed.
